Common Ground: Defeating Fascism and Remembering the Victims on the 71st Anniversary of the Liberation of Jasenovac

Brothers and Sisters!

Once again it is my honor to welcome you to the 15th Annual Days of Jasenovac Commemoration, Conference and Dinner here in New York. As we go to press with this year's conference journal we have received the terrible news of the tragic burning of St. Sava's Serbian Orthodox Cathedral in Manhattan. We stand together with our Serbian brothers and sisters in offering our support for the rebuilding of St. Sava's.



This year's conference and dinner has taken as its theme "Common Ground: Defeating Fascism and Remembering the Victims." While Serbs, Jews and Romas were the victims of genocide perpetrated at Jasenovac by the Croatian fascists and their Nazi collaborators throughout the territories of the former Yugoslavia, we draw inspiration from their common struggle against fascism. Serbs rose up, either as Chetniks or Partisans, and fought the Nazis and the Ustashe. Jews and Romas also fought with the Partisans in large numbers. Serbs, Jews and Romas had a unique experience of being targeted for extermination by the fascists. They shared a common struggle and common graves. Today they experience in common the institutionalized omission of much of their tragic story. Nowhere has this been more painfully exemplified than at the 1993 opening of the US Holocaust Museum, where there was no mention of Jasenovac and the Holocaust in Yugoslavia.

This year's conference theme is also inspired by the goal of peace and reconciliation between all peoples of the former Yugoslavia. In order to prevent future aggression and crimes of racial hatred, we must work towards reconciliation. But no sustainable peace, much less reconciliation, can be built unless there is a recognition of the past crimes and justice for the victims. We must deal directly with the unresolved issues that stand in the way of reconciliation. There is no other way forward. To that end, our distinguished panelists will confront some of these unresolved questions: Jasenovac and neo-fascism in Croatia; the Ratlines; the victimization of Serbian women in Bosnia in the 1990s; and the terrible persecution of Romas past and present. The JRI is calling upon the UN to establish a commission to address these unresolved matters relating to genocide in the former Yugoslavia.

As we remember our martyrs and their heroic resistance, let's not forget what can be achieved through unity. By honoring the victims at Jasenovac we also are working for peace, reconciliation, and a better and more democratic world. Sa bratskim pozdravima [with brotherly greetings],

Jasenovac, which represents the greatest crimes of genocide ever committed in the Balkans, has been largely overlooked by Western scholars, while its legacy has been distorted and its victims have been either ignored or victimized yet again by Holocaust revisionists. Central to the lessons of Jasenovac is the slogan "Never again!"

Learnin

However, the failure to observe this warning and to recognize the great crimes committed at Jasenovac has reaped not only the expected consequences of a revival of fascism in the Balkans, but with it, a deadly, racist demonization of the Serbian people. For these reasons, this foundation, and all individuals and work connected to it, are dedicated both to preserving the memory of Jasenovac and to the search for justice for its victims.

The JRI's work includes the publishing of scholarly and testimonial literature on the Holocaust in the former Yugoslavia, the organizing of conferences and other educational events to promote Holocaust awareness as it concerns the victim nationalities of fascist Croatia, and advocating for recognition and redress for the victims of Ustashe genocide. The JRI also strives to aid and give voice to the victims of the renascent neofascist movements active in the Balkans since the 1990's and to show the links between the crimes of these groups and those of their WWII-era antecedents.

from the Past

The JRI published the book, Jasenovac and the Holocaust in Yugoslavia, a collection of scholarly analyses and survivor testimonies from the First Annual Conference and Exhibition on the Jasenovac Concentration Camps. It also re-published, with a comprehensive English language summary, The Crimes of the Fascist Occupants and Their Collaborators Against the Jews in Yugoslavia.

The "Black Book," as it's also known, is one of the most authoritative volumes on the Jewish Holocaust in Yugoslavia but saw very limited distribution in its original issue over 60 years ago. The JRI won the approval of the City of New York to establish the first public monument to Jasenovac victims outside the former Yugoslavia, in Brooklyn's Holocaust Memorial Park.

The Institute is a litigant in a class action suit against the Vatican Bank in the matter of the looting and laundering of Holocaust victims' assets, and assists in the collecting of data for the processing of victims' claims. The JRI commissioned photographer Elizabeth Bieber to travel to Kosovo, where she documented the desperate situation of minority Roma and Serbs, victims of shameful pogroms carried out under UN-KFOR occupation following the 1999 NATO bombing campaign.

15th Annual Commemoration Ceremonies

Every year we gather to commemorate April 22, 1945, the day of the self-liberation of the last prisoners of Jasenovac, and the end of the Holocaust in Yugoslavia. We honor the hundreds of thousands of Serbs, Jews, Romas and anti-fascists who were murdered by the Ustashe and Nazis, and we recall the lessons of the Holocaust. Today we reflect on the 71 years that have passed, and contemplate what lies ahead for future generations.

It is our belief that we can build a better world based on human rights and compassion for all peoples only through an understanding of the lessons of Jasenovac and the Holocaust. And, therefore, it is vitally important to educate the world about these lessons, and pass along this dedication to remembering the victims to younger generations.

The last starving, exhausted and unarmed prisoners of Jasenovac who decided to throw their bodies at machine guns and barbed wire on that day of liberation, did so with only one purpose -- so that at least one of them would survive and tell the world what happened there. They died for us, and for all future generations, to let the truth be known, and to never forget! We hear the victims speak to us still and say: NEVER AGAIN!
