Dear Comrades,

This brief issue of the Mobilizer is to help orient you to the work for the last few days of the elections and the schedule of post-election activities.

THE OCT. 29TH RALLIES

There will be extensive coverage of the two rallies in the PDW. There will also be opportunities to discuss the rallies in upcoming meetings. Just briefly, we want to say that they were tremendous successes. Over 500 people in Harlem and 225 people in Co-op City, turnout is indicative of the response to the Independent-Progressive line, the content of the campaigns and to our candidates. Many people, Party and non-Party, worked very hard to make these rallies a success. Special appreciation of the role of Angela Davis and of our two candidates, Charlene Mitchell and Mike Zagarell, should be noted.

NOV. 8TH

November 9th is the time to start analyzing the elections. In these last few days it is the duty of all communists and all progressives to do everything possible to maximize the anti-Bush vote. Activity should be coordinated through the Independent Progressive office, 11 John St. (212-732-2025) and in the Bronx through the Zagarell office.

Just a few last minute, hopefully, helpful hints:

- * Saturday should be a mass mobilization day - motorcades - leafletting - door-to-door and on street corners.
- * Every vote counts - working your phone book - sending letters or postcards to your friends - talking to your neighbors - family - co-workers - adds up.
- * last minute postering is extremely effective. Priorities should be busy subway steps - areas where we've done concentrated work - and by the polling places where people will be voting. (The law is that you can do electioneering within 100 feet of the booth. It is implemented as within 100 feet

- of the entrance to the building where the voting takes place.
- * Distributing palm cards for Mitchell-Zagarell and other progressive and anti-Reagan candidates at the polling places where we've done concentrated work is important to do.
 - * Taking the vote in these concentration EDs is also important. You will need written authorization from the Mitchell & Zagarell campaigns to do this.
 - * There will be campaign parties after the polls close Tuesday night. Call John Street for info on the city-wide party. The Zagarell party will be at the campaign office, 2918 Holland Ave.

BALLOT PROPOSITIONS

#1 - NO - Even though we need highway construction throughout the state, this is a giveaway of tax dollars to the banks at a \$2 or \$3 to \$1 ratio.

#2-6 - YES - These charter proposals (NYC only) are not the substantive reforms that are needed. But as far as they go they're worth supporting.
