Dear Friends,

The time to break Nixon's back on the bombing of Cambodia and further U.S. intervention in Indochina is now.

- The Watergate mess has placed Nixon in a defensive position.
- Congress has for the first time defied Nixon, voting 219 to 188 on May 9 to deny additional funds for the bombing of Cambodia.
- On May 14, a Senate Appropriations sub-committee voted down a Defense Department request to pay for continued bombing and the Senate Foreign Relations Committee approved the Case-Church amendment to cut off the use of any funds for unauthorized military actions anywhere in Indochina.
- The conservative dominated Senate Appropriations Committee voted 24 to 0 to cut off all funds for bombing Cambodia.

Senator Thomas Eagleton asked on the Senate floor why the progressive movement hasn't acted to stop the bombing of Cambodia, of which the latest Gallup poll shows 57% of the American people disapprove, while only 29% approve. WE NOW PLAN TO ACT. On Saturday, June 16th, there will be a mass march from Watergate to the Justice Dept. The date signifies the first anniversary of the Watergate break-in. Aspects of the march are discussed in the enclosed leaflet. We ask that you read it and act on them. Order bus tickets now.

We ask you only to remember that our struggles are not over; that the SICPJ (formerly the SIPC) will continue to do all that it can, and trust you will too.
