On Saturday, August 6, 1988 there will be a rally held at the site of the proposed Stapleton nuclear navybase (Canal & Front Strreet) between the hours of 1 PM and 3 PM under the slogan -

"NEVER AGAIN, HIROSHIMA - 1945, STAPLETON - 1988"

The anniversary of the first time nuclear weapons were used in war will serve as a reminder of their destructive power and the danger these weapons represent to our local community and the entire world.

The adverse effect the nuclear navybase will have on the quality of life on Staten Island will be immediate and widespread, The effect these weapons would have if they were ever used would be permanent and total.

It is vital you come to this event against nuclear weapons being placed in your own backyard.

Bring your family, friends, co-workers and neighbors to this event with you, to stop another Hiroshima before it happens, to prevent Staten Island from become the navy's version of Three Mile Island and the harbor from becoming a radioactive Love Canal.
